SUBJECT:

TIWG Meeting regarding Buckley Kidnapping

The TIWG convenes at 2:00 p.m. today in Room 208, OEOB to deliberate next steps in our efforts to rescue Beirut COS Bill Buckley. There is growing concern that this is not a team effort and that we could well be doing more. Our objectives for the meeting should be:

- -- To determine the current level of information and effort.
- -- To arrive at some consensus regarding what more (if anything) can be done.

The memo from Secretary Shultz to the President (Tab A) provides a summary of actions take to date. We should plan to forward this to the President after today's meeting. The agenda at Tab B covers each of the points relevant to the Buckley case. The agenda points us twoard a posture that would be more responsive, should Buckley be found. Defense and State agree that we might have to react in a matter of hours. Our current disposition would preclude action by any forces other than the Marines offshore—who are not trained/equipped for the specialized tasks JSOC can perform.

There is resistance at JCS for moving to an Intermediate Staging Base (ISB). They believe that until we have a better fix on Buckley's location (Beirut, Damascus, Tehran, other) we should not degrade our response capability by pre-positioning forces in the wrong locale. JCS does support moving the rest of the Incident Response Team (IRT) as

U.S. Efforts in Response to the Abduction of William Buckley

CIA Station Chief Bill Buckley was kidnapped in Beirut the morning of March 16. We are using every available diplomatic channel to encourage his safe and rapid return. We are also taking steps to prepare for a rescue operation should it prove necessary.

Within a few hours of Buckley's abduction, we had contacted all of the main Lebanese government officials and militia leaders who could be helpful, both in Beirut and in Lausanne, where the Lebanese reconciliation talks are underway. Reggie Bartholomew also called.

Reggie also instructed that all U.S. personnel be drawn inside the Embassy perimeter and that any personnel leaving the perimeter travel by car with a chauffeur and bodyguard.

We have also sought Syrian cooperation. Within a few hours of Buckley's abduction, we approached Foreign Ministry officials in Damascus requesting that all Syrian security checkpoints in Lebanon be on the lookout for Buckley. Shortly after, we also met with the chief aide to Syrian Vice President Rifa'at al-Assad. The aide said Syrian units in Beirut and at Damascus airport would be notified immediately and requested a photograph of Buckley which we later delivered.

Damascus have been monitoring all Iranian aircraft departures from Damascus airport to verify that Syrian officials are watching for Buckley. Moreover, our consular officer in Damascus has met Lebanese as well as Syrian security officers at the main Lebanese-Syrian border crossing to alert them to Buckley's abduction.

We do not have any firm evidence as to who is responsible for Buckley's kidnapping or where he is being held. The conflicting intelligence reports we have received suggest either the complicity of Iran or pro-Iranian factions.

Buckley was kidnapped by supporters of the Dawa group which was responsible for the bombings in Kuwait last December. These sources believe Buckley is being held in order to provide a bargaining chip for release of the twelve Dawa defendents on trial in Kuwait for those bombings. We do not have any comfirmation of these reports, however, and based on available evidence cannot judge if the reports are valid. If they are, the kidnappers should surface with demands within the next few days, because the trial in Kuwait is nearing its end and convictions as well as executions are expected.




